The month of May has included two major milestones for Pastor Charles, both of which are blessings for our congregation.

On Monday, May 11, our congregation held a Special Charge Conference during which we voted to move Pastor Charles from half-time to full-time effective June 01, 2020. This change was originally submitted to Bishop Carcaño and the Cabinet for their approval. (The Cabinet is comprised of the Bishop and all five of the District Superintendents for our Annual Conference.) As Margie M. put it, "He's already been putting in fulltime hours. Now we'll actually be paying him for it!" This change will most likely result in Pastor Charles remaining in Susanville for many years.



## "I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my loving eye on you."

Leadership is a fascinating topic and one of the hottest marketing words of the past 20 or more years. The quote above comes from Psalm 32:8 and is one of several verses that speak to the interactive nature of Christian leadership. I believe God plants the seeds of leadership by calling and equipping *everyone* to lead with a servant's heart, always seeking God's wisdom and direction.

With Isaiah as one of our models, it is our job to respond to God's call by saying, "Here am I; send me!" (Isaiah 6:8). 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are to fully live into the visions God shares with us (Philippians 4:13 and 1 Thessalonians 5:24).

Well that all sounds great, but inspiring words ring hollow and fall flat if they are not supported by steady commitment, discipline, and training – all of which lead to multiple forms of growth.

During our Special Charge Conference on May 11, we also voted to task our Church Council with exploring how our church can move from our current structure of numerous committees to a "Single Board Governance" structure. We anticipate the Church Council will be able to provide their recommendation(s) before our next Charge Conference in November. The huge benefit we expect is fewer committee meetings and more effective use of our time and resources.

I would neglect my role as your pastor if I did not do everything in my power to equip our Church Council with the best resources I can find and do all I can to help them determine what is best for our congregation and our community.

With that in mind, in the coming weeks and months, I plan to create a Leadership Development Group which is open to *everyone*. To facilitate this, an anonymous donor has given us \$1,000 to launch a new Leadership Development Fund.

These are exciting times for our church. I will share dates, times, and materials with you as quickly as I can. Stay tuned, and get ready!

# **Understanding Our Faith and Traditions**

### Church Colors – Why White?

What a time we have had since our last installment! For ten Sundays, we lived with the color purple, which symbolized the suffering that our Lord was to expect, then lived through. Even though he told his disciples several times what to expect, they just could not wrap their minds around Jesus being killed for (to them) no reason (the Pharisees thought it was pretty obvious).

However, Jesus lived out what he had told his disciples, was crucified as a political example to those who would follow *him* and not *Rome*, and was buried amid much sorrow by his followers.

Sometime between being placed in the tomb and Sunday morning, Jesus was raised. How? No one knows. And what does the how matter anyway? He was raised. Hallelujah!

We celebrate that resurrection with the color **White**. Again, white speaks of purity. Jesus was

pure. His life was lived without any wavering to the opinions of others. So Jesus was raised. So what? What about us? 1 Corinthians 15:42 says: So it is with the resurrection of the dead. The [human] body that is sown is perishable and mortal, it is raised imperishable and immortal. (Amplified Bible)

And in John 14:3: And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and I will take you to Myself, so that where I am you may be also. (Amp)

There it is; the color white can remind us that we also, one day, will be where Jesus is. Hallelujah!

Even though no one is at the church building, the colors have changed to white. For the next six weeks, let the color white be with you and remind you of this promise. Clouds are white, flowers are white, snow is white. Creation revels in this good news. Amen! ~ Dennis R.

## Wear Red (or White) for Pentecost!

On Pentecost Sunday (May 31), we remember the day the disciples received the Holy Spirit in a special way. The story in Acts 2 describes a powerful wind and tongues of fire as the Holy Spirit was poured out on people from all over the world who came to Jerusalem to celebrate a Jewish feast. At the first Pentecost over 3,000 people were baptized, creating the first church. This is why Pentecost is often called the birthday of the Christian church.

The word Pentecost comes from a Greek word meaning fiftieth. The Jewish Festival of Pentecost (called *Shavuot*, meaning "weeks" in Hebrew) falls on the fiftieth day after the original Passover. On that day, God gave the Torah to Moses on Mount Sinai. The Christian festival of Pentecost falls on the 50th day after the resurrection of Jesus.

Pentecost for Christians celebrates the work of the church begun on Easter Day. In early Christianity, Easter Day was the primary day for baptisms. The newly baptized were then trained in basic Christian doctrine, including the meaning of the sacraments they had now experienced, as they prepared to take up their ministries in the life of the church. On Pentecost, Christians celebrate the commissioning of new members into ministry.

Two colors are historically associated with Pentecost. Red is a visual reminder of the "tongues of fire" that empowered the apostles and others to proclaim the good news of Christ's resurrection in many languages to the crowds of pilgrims from many lands (Acts 2:3). White is also used because Pentecost was the major day for baptisms in the early church. Those being baptized were given new white robes to wear as a sign they had taken off the world, died to sin, and were raised with the risen Christ to new life. This is why Pentecost is referred to as "Whitsunday" or "White Sunday" in England and Europe.

## Peace with Justice Sunday – June 7, 2020

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**Peace with Justice Sunday** is traditionally celebrated on Trinity Sunday (the first Sunday after Pentecost), which this year is June 7. One of The United Methodist Church's six special Sunday offerings, Peace with Justice Sunday (PWJS) supports annual conference ministries as well as global denominational work.

Of your offering for PWJS, half of the money is used in our annual conference and half supports the ministries of the General Board of Church and Society. PWJS funds are used through United Methodist channels to:

• relate the gospel of Jesus Christ to the church, communities & the world in which members live;

• bring the whole of human life into conformity with God's will; and

• show that reconciliation involves personal, social and civic righteousness.

PWJS is an opportunity for United Methodists around the world to remind ourselves of our Social Creed and our Social Principles that are an integral part of our Wesleyan heritage. Your generous donations are greatly appreciated and will impact lives both near and far.

## The UMC's Social Creed

As found in *The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church 2016* ¶ 166

We believe in God, Creator of the world; and in Jesus Christ, the Redeemer of creation. We believe in the Holy Spirit, through whom we acknowledge God's gifts, and we repent of our sin in misusing these gifts to idolatrous ends.

We affirm the natural world as God's handiwork and dedicate ourselves to its preservation, enhancement, and faithful use by humankind.

We joyfully receive for ourselves and others the blessings of community, sexuality, marriage, and the family. We commit ourselves to the rights of men, women, children, youth, young adults, the aging, and people with disabilities; to improvement of the quality of life; and to the rights and dignity of all persons.

We believe in the right and duty of persons to work for the glory of God and the good of themselves and others and in the protection of their welfare in so doing; in the rights to property as a trust from God, collective bargaining, and responsible consumption; and in the elimination of economic and social distress.
